Public and Stakeholder Engagement Manager Announcement

Calgary, AB – The Canadian Cattlemen's Association (CCA) is pleased to announce Jill Harvie will be assuming the role of Public and Stakeholder Engagement Manager, effective September 1. Harvie will assume the role from Tom Lynch-Staunton, who helped establish the initial Issues Management Program that has evolved into today's Public and Stakeholder Engagement Program for industry. The program seeks to achieve Connectivity

and Beef Demand goals as outlined in the National Beef Strategy and is funded through the Canadian Beef Cattle Check-Off.
