2025 NSCP PROGRAMS

Nova Scotia Beef Herd Renewal and Improvement Program*

A funding program for elite sires, heifer retention, seed stock development, herd health, preconditioning services, VBP+ audits, and surveillance systems.

Application Deadline: February 15, 2026 (first come first served)

***This program has been EXTENDED through to February 2029, thanks to funding provided by the Nova Scotia Department of Agriculture. Changes to HEIFER RETENTION for the 2026 program year (opening April 1, 2026) include:**

- \$800 per retained bred heifer (an increase of \$500 from the current program offering of \$300!)
- Heifers will only be eligible once in their lifetime
- Annual marketings will be tracked for growth for producers who apply multiple years
- Heifers must be retained for 5 years



Nova Scotia Soil, Pasture & Forage Management Program

A funding program for lime purchases, and/or soil, manure and feed analyses.

Application Deadline: November 30, 2025

Here's a snapshot of what the Nova Scotia Cattle Producers have been working on over the past few months:

Atlantic Forage Field Day

On August 6th, NSCP board representatives attended the Maritime Beef Council's 11th Annual Atlantic Forage Field Day in Nappan, NS. With nearly 90 participants—including producers, extension staff, students, and industry stakeholders—it was a strong day of learning and networking. The day featured presentations from Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada, Perennia Food and Agriculture, Agri-Commodity Management Association, and Atlantic Living Labs. Attendees also had the chance to view equipment displays from Kingston Farm Supply and Hustler Equipment.

Pasture Walks & Climate Change Strategy

As part of our ongoing work on the Nova Scotia Cattle and Sheep Sector Climate Change Adaptation Strategy, we partnered with Perennia Food and Agriculture and the Sheep Producers Association of Nova Scotia to host pasture walks this summer and fall across the province. In August, Geoff Larkin, Climate Change Coordinator, hosted Silvopasture workshops in Falmouth and Old Barns, where over 60 attendees learned the processes, opportunities, and practical implementation of silvopasturing from guest speaker Brett Chedzoy, Cornell University.

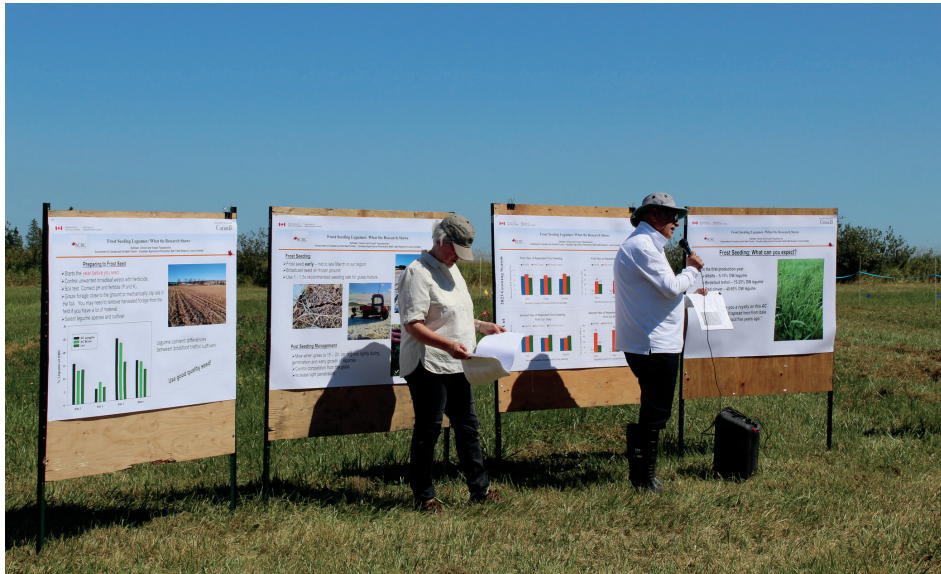
MBC & AAFC HOST 11TH ANNUAL FORAGE FIELD DAY



The 2025 edition of the Forage Field Day was held on August 6th in Nappan, NS at the Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada Research Farm. This year's event had 85 attendees turn out from New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and Prince Edward Island and included farmers, extension agents, and industry. The support of the various sponsors and partners like the PEI, NB, and NS Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership, the Farmers for Climate Solutions FaRM program, and the various sponsors of the Maritime Beef Council is invaluable to be able to put on these types of programs at a low or no cost to the producers who attend.

The morning program featured a trip out to the AAFC plots and the beef and forage research team of Dr. Kathleen Glover, Dr. Yousef Papadopoulos, and John Duynisveld all talked about the various research projects that have been ongoing at the farm relating to bioactives, parasitic nematodes, frost seeding and legume incorporation, and management through drought. This was a great opportunity which many took to engage with the researchers to establish how to use the work happening locally in Nappan to improve their own forage production on farm.

The afternoon sessions featured PEI's Les Halliday, who presented on the importance of measuring forage production, followed by an update from the NS, PEI, and NB Living Labs projects, who are now seeing results from some of these multi-year farmer collaborator projects that have been happening in the Maritimes. This was followed by a couple of equipment demonstrations/talks from Kingston Farm Supply and their Arrowquip cattle handling systems and Rangeward fencing products, as well as Leonard Fraser, who brought a Hustler-mounted bale unroller to demonstrate. Shane Wood, Geoff Larkin and John Duynisveld then hosted a presentation about frost seeding which held some very practical tips about the various ways that can be done and some of the challenges and opportunities to get more legumes into the mix.



The feedback on the day has been very positive, with farmers taking elements learned that day back to incorporate into their farm operations. The Maritime Beef Council looks forward to continuing this annual event with AAFC and other partners. CLIMATE ADAPTATION LEADERSHIP PROGRAM (CALP) UPDATE

This summer, over 60 producers and industry staff attended pasture walks in Falmouth and Old Barns to learn about silvopasture. Silvopasture is an agroforestry practice that integrates trees, forage, and livestock. Led by Brett Chedzoy, a forester and farmer from New York, the workshops showed how managing woodlots for grazing can boost productivity and help farms adapt to our changing climate. Manning Family Farm and Round Barn Farm were excellent hosts and provided a great environment to explore the topic further.

Silvopasture isn't just about turning animals loose in the woods. It starts with thinning the canopy to let sunlight in and managing debris to establish a healthy seedbed for forage. Grazing is done rotationally to control brush, suppress weeds, and support tree health. The goal is roughly 50% canopy cover (around 60 ft² of basal area per acre). The idea is to let in enough light to grow grass while still providing shade and shelter.

One key takeaway was the concept of "living barns:" establishing shelterbelts or evergreen stands that protect livestock during storms or extreme heat. Brett described using different wooded areas on his farm for shelter during blizzards and cold snaps, saving on infrastructure costs while improving animal welfare.

With more heat stress, dry spells, and intense storms in Nova Scotia, silvopasture offers real benefits. Shade keeps animals cool and extends the grazing season. Tree roots improve soil structure and hold moisture, helping pastures withstand extremes. Plus, it's a chance to make use of underutilized woodlots already on the farm.
