## MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

Another hot summer has come and gone, and we have been busy planning upcoming events and working on current projects.

We attended the 2022 Canadian Beef Industry Conference (CBIC) on August 16<sup>th</sup>-18<sup>th</sup> in Penticton, British Columbia. The three-day conference featured intriguing presentations and many knowledgeable panel discussions. I can also announce that I will join the Agency as a Primary Producer for Nova Scotia and will continue to Chair the Governance Committee. We continue to deliver the *On-Farm Cattle Preconditioning Pilot Project*, funded by the Nova Scotia Government and the Beef Cattle Research Council. This project aims to improve cattle herd health in the province by increasing the quantity and quality of vaccinated brood cows and pre-conditioned feeder calves. Specifically, the project focuses on recruiting farms identified through previous projects and programs that do not currently have an on-farm pre-conditioning program. The project also recruits farms that want to enhance their pre-conditioning program by adding specified practices. This year we are happy to offer three programs for producers to encourage genetic selection in the industry, as well as improve soil, pasture, and forage management quality. The Female Breeding Stock Funding Draw, which occurred at the Annual Meeting in March, allotted three producers \$750 each towards purchasing a heifer and/or young cow. Additionally, the Nova Scotia Genetic Improvement Program, including elite sire purchases, carcass ultrasounds and genomic testing, awarded 16 producers aid, with the Soil, Pasture and Forage Management Program awarding ten producers financial assistance for soil testing and lime purchases. There is also a Department of Agriculture CAP program open to eligible cattle producers in the province: the Cattle and Sheep Industry Development Program.

The Maritime Beef Test Society (MBTS) will once again offer a test this year, with consignment forms now available on their website at <a href="https://www.maritimebeefteststation.ca">www.maritimebeefteststation.ca</a>, which will be due back in October. We expect the MBTS Annual Meeting to take place in November 2022. Additional information regarding the Annual Meeting will be posted to the website as it becomes available.

There are many Nova Scotia Department of Agriculture CAP Programs available for producers, including the Cattle and Sheep Industry Development Program. This program provides funding for producers to invest in livestock and helps to address tight cash flow when increasing livestock numbers as well as improving industry competitiveness and resilience. ### NSCP AVAILABLE PROGRAMS

The NSCP have two programs available for producers for 2022:

- The Nova Scotia Genetic Improvement Program (formerly the Elite Sire Program)

  This provides funding for applicable sire purchases, as well as for genomic testing and carcass ultrasound.
- The Nova Scotia Soil, Pasture & Forage Management Program
   This program provides funding for lime purchases and soil, manure and/or feed analyses.

These programs both have an application deadline of November 30, 2022, and are both one-step process applications. No applications will be reviewed before the application deadline, so there will be no follow-up on missing documents. Applications will only be considered if all necessary information is provided. ### ON-FARM CATTLE PRECONDITIONING PILOT PROJECT

We continue to offer pre-conditioning services to producers through our *On-Farm Cattle Preconditioning Pilot Project*, funded by the Nova Scotia Government and the Beef Cattle Research Council. This project aims to improve cattle herd health in the province by increasing the quantity and quality of vaccinated brood cows and preconditioned feeder calves. Specifically, the project will focus on recruiting farms identified through previous projects which do not currently have an on-farm preconditioning program. The project will also recruit farms that want to enhance their preconditioning program by adding specified practices.

Producers will be able to book any combination of available onfarm services through the NSCP office. Our pre-conditioning services include:

- Handling equipment and help
- Tagging
- Age verification
- Vaccination administration
- Castration
- Dehorning
- Weighing

For producers to participate in these on-farm services, they must:

- participate in workshops and training,
- have a valid Veterinary-Client-Patient-Relationship (VCPR),
- · participate in the Herd Health Program
- have a valid Premise Identification (PID)
- complete age verification
- be in good standing with the Nova Scotia Cattle Producers

Services will be performed by technician Scott Dixon and his team at the Atlantic Stockyards Ltd. The NSCP office will coordinate farms by geography to reduce costs and travel redundancy. The cost structure for this service will be the same as the carcass ultrasound:

- Flat call fee (TBD)
- Hourly chute service fee \$35.00
- Travel (\$0.4585/km)

\*For this pilot project, only the chute service fee of \$35/hour will be charged to the producer. 
the Verified Beef Production Plus podcast, Simply Verified Beef – the Podcast, which just launched July 2021.
